Topic: Ethical Writing


Speaker: Prof. Pallavi Mohite (Pragati Mahavidyalaya Sawkheda)


- 1. Plagiarism: Prof. Mohite explained the various forms of plagiarism, emphasizing that it is not limited to verbatim copying of text. It also includes inadequate paraphrasing, improper citation, and presenting someone else's ideas as one's own. She stressed the need for originality and the ethical implications of failing to acknowledge others' contributions.
- 2. Data Manipulation: Another critical issue discussed was data manipulation, where researchers might intentionally alter data to achieve desired outcomes. Prof.Mohite underscored the importance of presenting data honestly and transparently, which is crucial for the credibility of research findings.
- 3. Improper Citation Practices: The speaker provided insights into the proper citation of sources, explaining the significance of giving credit to the original authors. She highlighted that accurate citations not only honor the work of others but also bolster the credibility of one's own research.

Guidelines for Ethical Writing: In her presentation, Prof.Mohite introduced participants to various guidelines for ethical writing, as outlined by reputable academic bodies and journals. She emphasized the following key principles:

- Respect for Intellectual Property: Researchers must respect the intellectual property rights of others and seek permission when necessary.
- Honesty in Research: Maintaining honesty in presenting research findings is paramount. Researchers should report their results transparently, regardless of whether the outcomes align with their hypotheses.
- Fairness in Collaboration: When collaborating with other researchers, it is vital
 to ensure fairness in authorship credit, acknowledging all contributors
 appropriately.
